

CHAPTER XIII  
GENEALOGICAL TABLES

EXPLANATION

The progenitors of the Battle family in America, so far as is known, were John Battle and Mathew Battle (probably John's brother). In the following Tables are given, as far as they could be procured, the names of all their descendants, with such facts about each as seemed most worth setting down. Tables 1-73 give the descendants of John, Tables 74-87 those of Mathew. The inset key shows the relation of the Tables.

The reference under the names heading a Table shows the previous Table in which the descent of the first name may be traced. For example, in Table 10 under the heading *Henry Laurens Battle* etc. the reference, *See Table 9*, means that Henry Laurens Battle's descent may be traced in Table 9.

The letter and numbers before the first name of a Table show the manner of descent from John or Mathew Battle. For example, in Table 10, *J. 1. 2. 6. 3. 3. 7. Henry Laurens Battle* means that Henry Laurens Battle was the seventh child of the third child of the third child of the sixth child of the second child of the first child of John Battle. Similarly in Table 79, *M. 1. 1. 1. 1. 1. 5. Nicholas William Battle* means that Nicholas William Battle was the fifth child of the first child of the first child of the first child of the first child of Mathew Battle.

After the first name of each Table are given, where possible, present or last place of residence, occupation, place and date of birth, place and date of death, manner of education, items of special interest, religious affiliation, place and date of marriage, name of husband or wife with, in parenthesis, the place and date of birth and death of that husband or wife and the names of the parents.

In the next line are given in like manner name and facts for the first child. The number 1 is prefixed in even line with the left margin of the page; the name and facts are set two ems to the right of the number.

In the next line come number 1, name, and facts for the first child of the first child of the head name, the number 1 being set not in even line with the left margin of the page but two ems to the right of the left line of the paragraph devoted to the first child, the name and facts two ems to the right of the number.

And so on. For every name all descendants are given as far as the Table will allow before the next brother or sister is taken up. The order of children is indicated by continuous numbering without regard to different marriages. The succession of generations is shown in the printing by offsets to the right. A son bearing the same name as his father is distinguished by II (not Jr.); the same name as his father and grandfather by III; and so on.

The abbreviations employed are mostly in common use and require no explanation. The following may be noted: b., born; d., died; ed., educated; m., married; s. of, son of; d. of, daughter of.

In each paragraph with the first place-name the name of the state is given; afterwards, the same state is to be understood until a new state is named and this in turn is to be understood until indication of a change.

Personal names are given in the form used by the bearer even if this conflicts with common usage today.

## DESCENDANTS OF JOHN AND ELIZABETH BATTLE

J. JOHN BATTLE was one of the founders of the Battle family in America. Family traditions show him to have been born in Yorkshire, England, but the exact date is not known. He married there Elizabeth —— (surname not known). In 1654, he emigrated to America with his family and a number of relatives and neighbors, among whom were Sumners, Hunters, and Bakers, and settled on the west fork of Nansemond River, in a district since known as Nansemond County, Virginia. He secured a royal patent, dated December 14, 1654, for 200 acres of land from the Governor of the Colony of Virginia. On September 25, 1663, he secured from the Royal Governor, Sir William Berkeley, additional grants, one of which included 640 acres of land located on the Paspetank (now called Pasquotank) River in North Carolina (See grants, Chap. V). He died about 1690. Children:

All went well until they reached Lake Pontchartrain where the boat caught fire at night. Unable to reach landing, gang planks were run out but the boat was too far from shore. Many lives were lost. All of Jesse Carter's family were saved but his wife received injuries from which she never recovered. Several of his slaves were burned. All his livestock and household goods were lost. When the safe was raised, the managers of the boat declared it had been robbed. Adding further to his troubles, all of his slaves except one died of cholera. The family finally made their way from Shreveport to Cherokee County, Texas, the home of his father, Christopher Anthony Carter, who, with other relatives and Masons, helped them to start life anew; m. 1st, Feb. 9, 1836, Joanna Ann Brooks, d. of George Brooks of N.
