## Joint Resolution of Thanks By Confederate Congress

(Approved February 6th, 1864)



HEREAS, the Alabama troops composing the brigade commanded by Brig. Gen. Cullen A. Battle, in the Army of Northern Virginia, volunteered in the service of the Confederate States in the early part of the year 1861, upon the first call for troops for the defense of Virginia, have participated in every battle fought by that army from the battle of Seven Pines to that of Gettysburg, always winning by their gallantry and devotion deserved praise and honor, and now, after enduring for nearly three years the hardships and dangers of active military service, have re-entitled for the war; therefore

**Resolved**, By the Congress of the Confederate States of America, that the thanks of Congress are due, and are hereby cordially tendered, to the Alabama troops, who, by their renewing the offer of their service to the country for the war in advance of any legislative action, have shown a spirit undaunted, a heroic determination to battle ever until the independence of their country is established, and a consecration to the cause of liberty worthy of imitation by their comrades.

**Resolved**, that the President be requested to communicate a copy of these resolutions, to the commander and troops of said brigade, as an evidence of the grateful appreciation by congress of their fortitude and heroism during the trials and dangers of the present and of their late act of patriotism, confirming their faith and reassuring the hope of the patriot.
