

IN THE NAME OF GOD, AMEN

I, George Gordon Battle, of the City, County and State of New York, Being of sound and disposing mind and memory, but being mindful of the uncertainty of this life, do hereby make, publish and declare the following as and for my last Will and Testament, hereby cancelling and revoking all previous wills, testaments and codicils made by me:

WHEREAS, by a series of trust agreements between my wife, Martha Battle, ~~and~~ and the Farmer's Loan and Trust Company of New York, and its successor, City Bank Farmer's Trust Company of New York, dated respectively- February 17, 1916; July 10, 1916; April 2, 1917; May 13, 1919; Feb. 10, 1922; July 31, 1926; Aug. 15, 1928; Feb. 20, 1929 and March 11th, 1932. the said Martha Battle, as donor, transferred to the said Trust Co. as trustee, certain securities referred to in the said trust agreements of the par value of Two Hundred Eleven Thousand Dollars (211,000.00), to be held by the said trust company under the terms and conditions and for the uses and purposes set forth in said trust agreements; and

WHEREAS, it was provided by the terms of the said trust agreements, that after the death of the survivor of my wife and myself, the said trust company shall distribute the principal of the trust funds then in its hands, among such persons and corporations, and in such proportions as I might by my last Will and Testament direct, and in default of such disposition by Will, the said Trust Co. shall distribute the principal, of the said trust funds to the persons who were at the time of my death, my next of kin, under the laws of the State of New York, and in the proportions fixed by such laws; and

WHEREAS, I have under the provisions of Section 403(d)(3) and Section 452(c) of the Revenue Act of 1942, as heretofore amended, released, renounced and relinquished the powers of appointment reserved to me under the said trust agreements, by an instrument to that effect dated the 31st day of October, 1944, duly executed and delivered, whereby the said powers of appointment reserved to me under the said trust agreements have been released, renounced and relinquished by me, and therefore cannot legally be exercised by me, nor do I desire to so exercise them, and that the said power of appointment have not at the present time been exercised by me;

**NOW, THEREFORE:**

**FIRST:** I do hereby give, devise and bequeath the following legacies:

(1) To my partners, and valued friends, Ludlow S. Fowler, Pearson E. Neaman, and Thomas Stokes, as evidence of my affection and regard, the sum of One Thousand Dollars (1,000.00) each.

(2) To Peggy Levy, the dear friend of my wife and myself, and the widow of my beloved friend and partner for many years, the late Isaac H. Levy, I leave as an evidence of my affection and regard to her personally, the sum of One Thousand (1,000.00) Dollars; and in addition, the sum of Five Hundred ~~EA~~ Dollars, for which I hope she will acquire such memento or souvenir, as she may choose of our dear Isaac.

(3) To my Secretary, Marguerite Deterling, as a token of my gratitude for her loyal and devoted services ~~XXXXXXXXXXXX~~ over many years, the sum of FIVE HUNDRED DOLLARS (\$500.00)

(4) I give, devise and bequeath to WESTRAY BATTLE BOYCE, my beloved niece, if she shall survive me, the sum of Two Thousand ~~XXXXXXXXXXXX~~ Five Hundred Dollars, as an evidence of my affection and gratitude.



IN THE NAME OF GOD, AMEN. Codicil -

I, George Gordon Battle, of the City, County and State of New York, do hereby make, publish and declare the following as and for a Codicil to my Last Will and Testament, heretofore made, published and declared by me on April 26th, 1948-

The said Codicil is as follows:

I hereby give, devise and bequeath to MARGUERITE DETERLING, as a token of my deep gratitude for her long and loyal service, the sum of Fifteen Thousand Dollars, to be payable to her upon my death. The said sum of Fifteen Thousand Dollars is to be a net payment to her, free and clear of all charges thereon, including Federal, State or local taxes; it being my desire that she shall receive on my death the said sum of Fifteen Thousand Dollars, free and clear, for her sole use and benefit. Any charges of any character, including any taxes, on the said sum are to be paid out of my general estate.

In my said Last Will and Testament, executed, made and published and declared on April 26th, 1948, I gave a legacy to the said Marguerite Deterling of Five Hundred Dollars, and it is my desire that the above mentioned sum of Fifteen Thousand Dollars shall be in addition to the said Five Hundred Dollars in my said Last Will and Testament.
